WHAT IS SAP?

The Student Assistance Program is designed to help direct and access school and community resources for students found to be in need. All information is confidential.



WHO CAN MAKE A REFERRAL?

Basically the answer to this question is ANYONE. Most referrals come from the student's teachers and/or parents. The student may also make a referral if he/she feels the need for help.

The SAP

Process Includes:

IDENTIFICATION:

Following a referral, parents and school personnel are asked to submit information that will help to determine if an assessment is appropriate.

DETERMINATION:

The SAP team reviews the information and determines if an assessment is in order.

ASSESSMENT:

With parent and student permission, assessments are conducted by community professionals who specialize in adolescent problems.

TREATMENT:

If the professional conducting the assessment recommends treatment, the student and parents will be assisted in contacting the proper agency and making arrangements to begin treatment.

REINTEGRATION:

Following treatment, a support team, monitored by the SAP team, assists the student in continuing the progress begun by the treatment.

How Does a Student Become Involved in the Program?

Our team will help you find services and assistance within the school and, if needed, in the community. We do not diagnose, treat, or refer your child for treatment. Rather, we will provide you with information. YOU make the choices.

What if Someone has Already Referred My Child to the Program?

First, know that your child was referred because someone is concerned about observable changes they are seeing in your child. Perhaps a teacher or friend has noticed changes in behavior and habits that you may or may not have noticed at home.

The SAP Team will request that you sign a permission form for your child to become involved in the program. Once you sign, the SAP Team will begin to work with you and your child. If you feel you need more information before making a decision, please let your SAP Team know. If you do not sign the permission form, the SAP Team will not become involved. Participation is voluntary.
