Teacher Assistant: This program is for senior students only. Students who elect Teacher Assistant typically do research, preparation and organization for the teacher they work with. The student should have a desire to pursue the subject are or secondary teaching. The Teacher Assistant Program is limited to 25 students. Students must maintain a minimum of a 2.75 GPA.

Open Campus: This program is for senior students only. Open Campus is a program that provides seniors with release time during the day to pursue career-related goals or additional knowledge not otherwise available in the school program. Students must secure a sponsoring agency and develop their schedule (5 days/week) with the sponsoring agency. Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.75.

GPA & Class Rank Computation:

Class rank and grade point average reflect the academic achievement of the student and are computed cumulatively on a 4.00 grading scale on the basis of grades earned in all courses taken in grades 9 through 12 for which credit is granted at Warwick High School. Grades earned in courses taken by students who have transferred to Warwick High School appear on the transcript, but those grades are not factored into the GPA. Students who transfer to Warwick High School after the start of their sophomore year are not a part of the class ranking system. All Advanced Placement courses will receive a 1.2 weight and all Honors courses will receive a 1.1 weight.

Students need to be enrolled at Warwick for a minimum of six (6) semesters to be included in class rank.
