

## Minutes

- 1. Welcome and Public Comment None
- Debt Review Ken Phillips, RBC Capital Markets Mr. Ken Phillips reviewed the Debt Profile & Refinancing Review presentation. He focused on the 2009 Bonds with a call date of 2/1/18. Mr. Phillips also explained the refunding differences between Non-Bank Qualified and Bank Qualified. Mr. Phillips led a discussion about the pros/cons of each option and supported the committee as they considered next steps related to bond refunding.

**Recommendation** – It is recommended that the Board approve the future refunding of the 2009 Bonds.

- 2015-16 Budget and Mid-Year Updates Mr. Wertsch shared that the 2014-15 year end financials were flat. The 2015-16 budget included significant rightsizing to eliminate much of the budget padding. Focusing on healthcare, Q1 was 38.2% over prior year (+525K expense). While state funding is still up the in the air, Mr. Wertsch reviewed the current fund balance commitments including projected operating deficits, pension rate stabilization, and capital project financing.
- 4. 2016-17 Budget Updates Mr. Wertsch reviewed that the 2016-17 opt out resolution passed with a 2.9% cap (+1.2M in local-based revenue). Mr. Wertsch reviewed the local taxable properties and the increase value from last year to this year. For 2016-17 budget, the current PSERS rate projection is at 30.03% (up from 25.84% or +700K expense). Finally, Mr. Wertsch shared 2016-17 Definite Budget Changes (Net Debt Service Increase/Admin. & Site Budget Rightsizing) and Potential Budget Considerations (Warwick Ware & Potential Bond refinancing). Mr. Wertsch answered additional questions related to the increase in healthcare costs.
- 5. 2015-16 Adult Lunch Price Increase to \$4.10 Mr. Wertsch shared the need to increase adult lunch prices due to the cost for adult lunch prices having to be based off of the highest food cost item. This will put us in compliance with federal regulations. This

has no impact to student lunch costs.

**Recommendation** - It is recommended that the Board approve the increase in adult lunch prices to \$4.10.

### John Beck -

School-wide assessments were completed in January and they were pleased with the progress their students made throughout the first half of the year. Spirit week was a success! Students enjoyed a pep rally with the senior members of the girls and boys basketball teams, a foul shooting contest with the teachers, and Spirit Night at the Warwick vs. Hempfield basketball game. Hank the Health Hero presented at their January PTO meeting about healthy dental habits. Centers were then set up throughout the library for families to learn about appropriate brushing techniques, healthy foods, etc. Student wellness activities such as Kids Move and the John Beck Swim Party were well attended.

#### Warwick Middle School -

They recently had 10 winners for the Scholastic Writing Contest. They had 4 gold winners, 4 silver winners, and 3 honorable mention winners (one of their students won two awards for separate pieces). WMS winners will be honored at the Scholastic Writing Contest Award Ceremony on Sunday, March 6 at Millersville University's Ware Center. Each year, the Alliance partners with more than 100 organizations across the country to bring the Awards to local communities. Teens in grades 7 through 12 apply in 29 categories of art and writing. Submissions are juried by luminaries in the visual and literary arts, some of whom are past award recipients. Panelists look for works that best exemplify originality, technical skill, and the emergence of a personal voice or vision.

On Tuesday, February 23, Warwick Middle School will hold a 7th grade assembly with Joseph Hirt, a holocaust survivor. They are excited to be able to provide this opportunity for our students.

The 2016 Future City competition took place at the Pennsylvania State Museum in Harrisburg on Saturday January 30, 2016. Warwick Middle School, the twice-defending regional champions, arrived with their city - Maracaibo. The Venezuela city features Catatumba, a constant lightning storm that ignites Maracaibo's nuclear fusion plant, that powers the city. Warwick's team won the competition to become "threepeat" Regional Champions. They have won four championships in the last five years and five total championships since the beginning of the Central PA Regional competition. The team will now return to Washington D.C. in mid-February to compete in the National competition.
