John Beck- John Beck's Elementary's school year got off to a great start and they welcomed 50 new students to the school. They kicked off the year with a Character Building Assembly emphasizing respect, responsibility, and being ready to learn. Kindergarten students and their parents were excited to visit their classrooms and conference with the teachers. John Beck is looking forward to a positive and successful 2015-2016 school year.

Bonfield- Bonfield had a great start off to the year as well with construction being wrapped up and the custodian doing a great job of getting everything ready. During the week of sep 14th, they will have their safety week with a different type of safety drill each day including fire, severe weather, and others. The week will be wrapped up with a peaceful school bus lesson on Friday for all bus riders. The summer reading challenge award winner will be celebrated on sep 18th. Mr. Berardi says "at Warwick we recognize the need to support the heart of students if we intend to maximize cognitive capacity. As Kissel Hill Climbers, and Warwick Warriors, we are proud to serve the "whole" student...mind and heart." Mr. Berardi and the rest of the staff at Kissel Hill would like to express their gratitude to the school board and committees for their passion and dedication which brings so many opportunities to the students.

Lititz El- The students at Lititz El were excitedly welcomed back to school by the LE faculty and staff. The school is giving big thanks to their custodial staff. The students had a great first couple days of school and they are excitingly welcoming the incoming kindergarteners and their parents for kindergarten welcome conferences.
