1. Welcome and Public Comment-
  - a. In Attendance; Bruce, Schreiter, Carl Kline, Ed Gooch, Millard Eppig, Jeff Weber, April Hershey, Nate Wertsch, Rob Marshall, Ryan Landis, Callie Neff
2. Softball Press Box – Ryan Landis, Athletic Director
  - a. Displayed a picture of the baseball press box and the softball press box
  - b. He explained that we need to make changes to softball due to inequity issues
  - c. Mr. Landis shared a copy of a quote from Behn Construction to build a similar structure
  - d. Due to the cost of this project he is looking at fundraising options to raise funds
  - e. Parent club has made a donation already. The account has over \$3,000.
  - f. He will collect other estimates before taking any further steps
  - g. Significant difference in cost pending WSD vs. Parent Organization funding
  - h. Committee asked about additional Title IV issues
    - i. Mr. Landis feels we are good in most other areas
    - ii. Participation for females in Bowling and Golf is the only other area
  - i. Mr. Landis explained that looking into this will alleviate state concern until it is completed
  - j. Committee was all in favor of moving forward with seeking funding and further estimates
3. Bonfield Measurement & Verification Study
  - a. Trane billed the District to provide this report approximately \$7,200.00
  - b. They will provide this report going forward for the same cost
    - i. We must determine if we are going to continue paying for the report
    - ii. They analyze one month of trend data to complete the report
  - c. Committee would like Mr. Wertsch to explore having them adjust the cost and complete it for one more year- Mr. Wertsch will send committee an update once he speaks with them
4. Radon Testing
  - a. Mr. Weber explained that the American Lung Association trained him regarding a radon-testing program for the District
  - b. They have a grant that would cover the initial cost of testing all buildings
  - c. He can submit a grant for all buildings to have this done
  - d. Committee agreed that we should be testing all buildings and that Mr. Weber should explore applying for the grant

5. Summer, Non-Repetitive, and General Buildings & Grounds Updates
  - a. RLPS- met to discuss general options moving forward
    - i. They will present to the Board on October 3<sup>rd</sup> and hold community meeting at WMS on October 11<sup>th</sup>
  - b. Mr. Weber Updates
    - i. Purchase new Resilite light-weight mats for competition
    - ii. Folding Gym Chairs- replacement chairs purchased
    - iii. WHS Scoreboards- up and running
    - iv. WMS Café Blinds- in and working well
    - v. WMS Projector- in stock and will be installed
    - vi. Field Hockey Practice Field- was completed by in house maintenance staff
    - vii. WHS Room 137- upgraded
    - viii. WHS Intercom System- installed and running
    - ix. Turf Field Cleaning- Turf, Track and Court came to cleaned field
      1. They shared concern that it is showing wear
      2. Mr. Webber is gathering reports to see if there are warranty issues
      3. The field is safe and able to be used
    - x. Tennis Courts- cracks are re-appearing, did some patching this summer
      1. These will need addressed in the near future

**2. Student Representative Report – Miss Paige Bogda**

**3. Update on curriculum guide/college & GPA credit – Dr. Ron Hallett**

- Dr. Hallett described a conversation begun with Harrisburg University that would allow a student to look at taking AP level classes that may align with a course offered at Harrisburg University. This would result in the attainment of credits, which may be transferred to other universities. This would be at a student cost of approx. \$99 per credit. A meeting is scheduled for later this month to formalize these conversations.

**4. Online Textbook Approval:**

- Each of the following were created through the expertise of our in-house educators. They are all ebooks vs. the traditional paper textbook.
- 7th Grade Science (Pilot 2017/2018) – Mr. Bobby Rhoads & Mr. Lee Walter
  - i. *Rationale: present resources were outdated and not aligned to present curriculum.*
  - ii. *Written using CK-12 Software*
  - iii. *District owns credentials to ensure resource can continue beyond the duration of any single district professional.*
  - iv. *Pilot is being asked for approval for this year (for 7<sup>th</sup> grade science). This means adjustments can be made throughout this year. They will then return to submit for final approval.*
- Genetics (Pilot 2017/2018) – Mrs. Krista Roe
  - i. *Rationale: Presently this course did not have a textbook. Present print books available are geared more toward college level. Ebook works well for flipped classroom model. An ebook also provides a way to naturally embed enrichment opportunities.*
  - ii. *Chapter opens with image and big ideas.*
- Oceanography (Pilot 2017/2018) – Mrs. Sarah Martens
  - i. *Rationale: Presently textbooks available had content too advanced for high school.*
  - ii. *Much of the textbook came from CK-12*
  - iii. *Chapters are also placed on Moodle.*
- Procedural Questions from the Committee
  - i. *Greatest challenge to writing: making sure the content is offered in language that makes sense to the level of the student being instructed.*
  - ii. *If CK-12 were to no longer exist, do we still have access to the content?: Yes – part of the agreement. Further these textbooks can be downloaded as well.*

**5. Other Items:**

- A committee member indicated that her son's math instruction in high school prepared him to succeed in his engineering program when many of his peers were unable to so. She is very appreciative to the high school calculus teachers.
