- 2. Overview of Committee/Welcome New Members Dr. Melanie Calender
 - a. Review of School Board Committee Structure (Purpose: Feedback vs. Decisions)

- 4. English/Language Arts K-6 Resource Dr. Ryan Berardi, Building Principal KHE
 - a. Rigor for complex thought when engaging in literature, and text complexity to which students are exposed, has increased.
 - b. Current resources include procured literature, projects, and assignments created by our teaching teams as well as traditional anthologies. These anthologies were fairly dated (over a decade).
 - c. Team of individuals spanning all grade levels, reading specialists, academic LFs, and a librarian came together to meet with two companies that offered the following (key components that narrowed down our invitations).
 - i. Updated anthology (stories with greater depth and complexity)
 - ii. All resources accessible online and able to integrate with LMS (example: Google Classroom)
 - iii. Engagement components (physical and digital) able to be searched quickly by standard.
 - d. McGraw-Hill's Wonders Anthology was selected as an updated resource. It is a tool to compliment a WSD curriculum...not the curriculum itself. We will fit this into our work by about year two of the ELA writing cycle. Year one begins this year.
- 5. Youth Court Overview Dr. Melanie Calender
 - a. Allows child an option to discuss situation vs. automatic traditional discipline.
 - b. Student participants who help run the youth court are engaged in a class. There is a class running where this could be embedded.
 - c. The focus is on sentencing vs. outcome, and builds on social/emotional focus.

In collaboration with the community, the mission of the Warwick School District is to enable all students to acquire the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to become responsible, productive, and resourceful citizens.

- d. The request right now is to simply start the training and then make a decision after training is complete.
