- 1. Welcome Mrs. Leslie Penkunas, School Board Member & Mrs. Emily Zimmerman, School Board Member
- 2. Student Representative Report *Mr. Liam Zee, Student Representative*John Beck held Fine Arts Day and Roller Skating Night. Bike Rodeo is coming up on May 17, Field Day will be coming up across the elementaries. MS: PSSA testing has ended and finals are the last week of May. The Warrior Code activity will be a masked singer event. Incoming 9th graders are preparing to transition to high school. Incoming 7th graders will be touring the buildings shortly. The 6th grade end of the year party will be on June 3 at the MS. The High School has AP testing occurring. The Spring Choral concert happened this last weekend in partnership with the Middle School. Finals are coming up and graduation will be on June 2nd. Student Council elections will be taking place.
- 3. English 9 Vocabulary- Textbook *Ms. Taylor Cole and Mrs. Laura Houghton*Taylor Cole and Laura Houghton shared a prospective vocabulary e-text for 9th grade vocabulary instruction. Past resources were reviewed, with challenges they presented shared (Vocabulary Workshop, Vocabulary.com; Quizlet). The team has been exploring a Warwick created vocabulary e-text made via google docs

and Canva. Research has shown that a variety of resources are needed to practice vocabulary. This is also cost effective for Warwick and aligns instruction for all 9th grade students. The vocabulary would come from what has been used as well as researched lists sharing best vocabulary for high school students.

4. Early Reach Coordination by the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation - *Dr. Melanie Calender, Assistant Superintendent*

Dr. Calender shared an opportunity for students who receive special education supports. OVR (Office of Vocational Rehabilitation) is a statewide support. They provide support for students and job training experiences. In addition, as individuals move on in life, supports are still available as a resource, not just for school aged students. The district is required to connect students with IEPS to OVR. We are exploring a representative from OVR coming into the classroom to receive classroom lessons about opportunities as well as mini lessons of skills for career opportunities. In the past, they were only approved for individual services, but they are newly able to support small groups or class level groups. The program is available with a wide range of needs. For this school year, if approved, families will be alerted that this would be happening via a letter. With time, it will be included in the IEP for families and students desiring this support.

5. Honoring Outgoing Committee Members - Dr. Lindsey Stock, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment

Matt Huber and Stacey Geesaman have served for 6 years on the committee, which is the maximum time to serve, so they were honored for their service to the district as they exit. Dr. Calender noted the two vacancies will be posted over the summer for individuals to apply.

- 2. 2023-24 Proposed Final General Fund Budget
 - Cause of Change
 - The budget breaks even at this time
 - Real estate tax collection percentage has increased
 - Favorable quarterly earned income tax
 - Interest rates continue to remain high
 - Increased to 5% for Federal Interest Rates
 - Current Budget
 - Main Changes
 - Increases on the local side
 - Interest increased
 - Governor's proposed budget has increased
 - No change on the federal side
 - Highest year in health insurance costs
 - Majority of costs go to salaries and benefits
 - numerous increases for support staff
 - Three Year Budget Highlight
 - Projected deficit well within our anticipated Act 1 index next year
 - Fund Balances and Approaches
 - Committed funds for PSERS/Health care stabilization and future budget deficits
 - If favorability, add to healthcare budget, if exposure assess fund balance use vs. tax increase
 - Not needing a tax increase next year operationally, but assessing for debt service

- Discussion centered around upcoming \$110 million in debt service in the next 5 years in renovations to high school and two elementary schools and possibility to put money aside for building
 - 0.55% increase in millage could bring in revenue to cover these renovations
 - o \$18 increase to median household
 - This would lessen \$21M in future interest expense
- Next steps
 - Take feedback to build formal PDE budget document for May board meeting
 - These numbers will continue to change throughout the month
 - Must publish intent to adopt budget in the Lancaster Newspaper
 - o Final budget will be finalized at June board meeting
