- 1. Welcome Mrs. Leslie Penkunas & Mrs. Emily Zimmerman

 Leslie opened and welcomed everyone to the first education committee meeting for the 22-23

 school year. She also introduced Emily Zimmerman as the co-chair with her on the committee.
 - 2. Education Committee Purpose/Role Review *Dr. Linsdey Stock, Director of Elementary Curriculum*

Dr. Stock read the education committee's purpose, noting how the education committee serves as a subcommittee of the school board, to refine recommendations made by school staff, not approving or denying curriculum or programming. The feedback gathered is taken to the school board to review where the board serves as the final say in the adoption of programming.

3. Student Representative Report - Mr. Liam Zee, Student Representative

John Beck had popsicles on the playground and the chalk walk organized by the PTO. The

middle school had a kick off assembly and BTSN is Sept. 22. Middle school sports are starting

out right now. High school sports are also underway. Homecoming and the associated pep rally

are occurring this week, with homecoming court events leading up to the weekend. The National

Honors Society is participating in the Schreiber Rubber Duck race, held indoors due to the

weather, with NHS students running games. NHS will also be working with the special olympics

this month as well as Luther Acres visitation with residents. Kissel Hill had Popsicles on the

In collaboration with the community, the mission of the Warwick School District is to enable all students to acquire the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to become responsible, productive, and resourceful citizens.

Playground, with over 300 popsicles consumed. Back to School Night occurred on September 8. Summer Reading Recognition also occurred. At Bonfield, they are having a lego theme this year, starting the year with a house sorting assembly to start the year. Students will be competing for house points throughout the year. They also had Cool Tools around the building to learn building expectations around the school. Liam asked if we could look to more rapidly informing students of PSAT/SATs testing dates. Dr. Szobocsan shared that now that Flex is at the end of the day, the information will be out more quickly. Liam also asked what would be involved in adding AP classes/IB programming. Dr. Szobocsan shared there are some now that haven't run based upon interest. He noted there would be an opportunity to open a course if there was interest. IB programming would take more legwork and cost for that type of instruction.

4. New Teacher Introduction - Dr. Lindsey Stock, Director of Elementary Curriculum,
Instruction & Assessment & Dr. Steve Szobocsan, Director of Secondary Curriculum,
Instruction & Assessment

Dr. Szoboscan shared a video from induction with each new staff member introducing themselves.

- 5. Curriculum Revisions 2021- 10th Grade ELA Dr. Steve Szobocsan, Director of Secondary Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment
 - a. Soldier Boy by Keely Hutton

Dr. Szobocsan noted that the Soldier Boy text that was part of the presentation in 2021 that was shared with the Education Committee. It was selected as a 10th grade text at that time. The area of concern at the time was the use of curse words with some violence. This was listed as an alternative to A Long Way Gone and Bite of the Mango. It had been recommended by the committee but had not been taken to the board due to a clerical error. The book was purchased and there were copies at the high school with the intention of it being used as an alternate text. It was clarified that this text might be a choice of title in combination with some other titles. Mrs. Zimmerman requested that as it is being presented to students that they were made aware of the violence within the title, communicating that ahead of time. Mrs. McMillion asked for time to read the text and weigh in, as she feels she cannot give an opinion without knowing more

information. The committee asked to be able to read it before the next meeting to make a final decision.

6. Update on book challenges: It Feels Good to Be Yourself: A Book About Gender Identity
- Dr. Lindsey Stock

Dr. Stock noted the title had gone through the book challenge process in the spring. In May/June, through the process, the book was chosen to remain on the shelves in the library.

7. High School LS English Resource/Book Proposal - Mrs. Ashley Driscoll, Warwick High School Learning Support Teacher

Mrs. Driscoll proposed a new resource to English 11/12 which is an adapted version of Hamlet in a graphic novel form from the No Fear Shakespeare series. This is an adapted translation of the traditional one from the anthologies, presenting more simple English for access. This would be used in supplement to the anthology. This would provide accessibility to a wide range of leaders. It also promotes Universal Design for Learning principles, allowing image representation. It will allow students to explore different genres of novels and is of high interest for students who are less motivated to read. This will fill a void of an adapted reader for this title. There was discussion that the title could be used to support learners in general education needing access to the title as well. The committee recommended this be taken to the board for approval.
