### Club and Activity Descriptions

<b>Aavidum</b>	Aavidum is WMS’s group of world-changers. We are middle school’s largest club, and we meet every other Thursday during Flex period in the auditorium. By design, our club serves two purposes: 1. We look to spread positivity and kindness throughout our school. 2. We are also a club that looks to provide support and resources for students struggling with mental health issues such as depression, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts. Any 7th or 8th grader who wishes to join the club must see the advisor(s) for an application. Aavidum wants every person in our building to know that “We’ve Got Your Back” no matter what.

<b>Choral Ensemble</b>	Choral Ensemble is our elite singing group here at Warwick Middle School. This is a year-long activity that explores choral music from a wide variety of cultures and time periods through study and performance. We emphasize vocal technique, sight-reading, and music theory. Students in Choral Ensemble are expected to participate in performances throughout the school year. Open to 7th and 8th grade students. Choral Ensemble rehearses Tuesday mornings before school, with some after school and weekend rehearsal throughout the season. Students must audition to be in Choral Ensemble. Auditions are in September at the beginning of the school year. Students interested in auditioning will receive more information at the beginning of the school year.
<b>Comic Book Club</b>	We meet periodically on Friday mornings to discuss graphic novels/comic books (not just Marvel/DC), time travel paradoxes, superheroes and villains, movie spoilers, plot holes, Easter eggs, and other controversial topics. We also watch clips from Marvel movies, sketch comic panels, play trivia games, and defend the world against Hydra domination. Basically, we get together and nerd out! Anti-heroes welcome.

<b>Environmental Club</b>	Students will work together to learn and protect the environment. They will help create ways to make the school more aware of how to protect the environment. Students will also participate in Envirothon in the spring.
<b>Gender Sexuality Alliance</b>	Gender Sexuality Alliance, or GSA is a club where LGBTQ+ students and allies work towards promoting acceptance of all students, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity. The club meets on a regular basis to plan future activities, events, and visuals that will promote an accepting and positive environment for all students.
<b>Heart &amp; Sole</b>	Heart & Sole is Girl’s on the Run program for middle school girls, and it creates a positive, structured space for middle school girls to learn about themselves, explore new ideas, cultivate empathy, strengthen connections and develop life skills that will help them as they move through adolescence and beyond. The Heart & Sole curriculum is rich with themes girls can relate to, addressing the whole girl - body, brain, heart, spirit and social connection - and building important life skills such as team building, developing a support system, boundary setting, decision making, asking for and providing help and more. Although there is a cost for the program, no girls are ever turned away based on ability to pay. We are really excited to be supporting middle school girls and their health as they navigate the crazy social world we live in! We would love to see you there!
<b>Jazz Band</b>	More information to come.
<b>Learning Lab</b>	Learning Lab is a quiet place for students to complete work or get support. Reasons students might attend Learning Lab are because they have missing/incomplete assignments, upcoming assignments/projects, need help with study skills, or organizational help. Students have the opportunity to receive additional support for these assignments or have a quiet place to work. Students are not required to come on a regular basis, more as an “as needs” basis. Passes for the morning are located in Ms. Matthew’s Room 215, Guidance, or the Cafeteria. Students attending afternoon learning labs should stay in homeroom until the final bell and then report to Mrs. Ferguson’s Room 110.
<b>Oratory Club</b>	The Oratory Club is a place to analyze, write, practice, and perform speeches. We will also play many fun public speaking-oriented games! Students who love to speak passionately are urged to join, as well as anyone interested in doing morning announcements for Warwick Middle School.

<b>Science Olympiad</b>	<b>Science Olympiad is a nationally recognized program that provides students the opportunity to investigate various fields of science, math, and technology. Students in Science Olympiad become experts in their events and then compete against other middle schools in the area at invitationals, a regional competition, and potentially a state and national tournament. Practices are held twice a week in season and roughly 20-30 students are selected for the program. The events themselves consist of subject specific events (i.e. rocks and minerals, disease detective, A&amp;P, heredity, etc.), lab-based events (i.e. crime busters, density lab, circuit lab, potions and poisons, etc.) and technology based events (mousetrap vehicle, elastic launch glider, bottle rocket, hovercraft, etc.). Funding for the program comes from Warwick Education Foundations sponsorship.</b>
<b>Sewing Lab</b>	<b>Sew Lab is a club open to any 7th or 8th grader who is interested in learning how to sew on a sewing machine. Meetings will take place after school, once a month. Over the course of the year, each club member will learn the parts of a sewing machine, practice stitching different seams, and make a drawstring bag! There is no fee to join the club, but students will be responsible for purchasing bag materials. Come learn to sew in a fun and relaxing environment!</b>
<b>Strategy Board Game Club</b>	<b>The Warwick Strategy Board Games Club is a club that meets at Warwick Middle School approximately every other Thursday from 3:10-4:15 in the Library. The Warwick Strategy Board Games Club plays strategy boards games such as: Ticket to Ride, King of Tokyo, Down Force, Risk, Azul, 7 Wonders, Splendor, and many others.</b>
<b>Student Council</b>	<b>Student Council is made up of both 7th and 8th grade students who complete an application process at the beginning of the school year. These students represent their peers in matters concerning the student body and typically meet on a bi-weekly basis. Student Council is a self-supporting organization that sponsors functions and projects that have educational and social merit and have been approved by administration and a majority of its members.</b>
<b>Yearbook</b>	<b>Yearbook is an application only extracurricular club that designs, sells, and produces the middle school's yearbook each year. Anyone who completes an application will be considered for a position in one or both committees of layout/design and/or photography. We meet Thursday mornings throughout the school year. 7th and 8th graders are encouraged to apply. You design it; we will all create it!</b>
